Christian theology is a big part of many people's lives. Every day people discuss and debate the topics and sub-topics of Christianity in hopes to learn from each other and develop a better understanding of the Christian faith. These people also express their thoughts by using such outlets as writing, poetry, and artwork. If there is one person that expresses himself through creativity, then there are twenty that admire that creativity.

RMFI is making a call for submissions for two proposed Books.

The first book *Becoming More Alive: Living Life Based on Biblical Principals* will be a collection of Bible based stories that illustrate a biblical principal for experiencing a more fulfilling life in Christ. These stories/messages should focus on biblical principals that every Christian should know and understand. Please avoid religious dogma or personal concepts. It is the hope that this book will work in a variety of different settings for individuals from all walks of life, and in order to do that, we must focus on Biblical principals and truths. The book will be composed of 12-15 chapters and each chapter will be approximately 4000 words.

The second book, *Pearls From the Pulpit: 365 Daily Jewels* will be a collection of those especially insightful and encouraging sparks that we have all had. It is that moment when it feels like God has just spoken to us personally. In the secular world we would call it a Paradigm shift, in education we call it the moment when the "light came on" and in some churches we would say "Our eyes were opened by the Holy Spirit and we understood" and some would say "we experienced an epiphany." These kinds of events often happen to pastors, Sunday school teachers, youth workers, and church staff all of the time but are not always shared. This book will provide an opportunity to share those little jewels with others. It is the hope that this book will be used as a daily reading activity and will encourage the reader to develop a daily bible reading habit. To encourage or expand this daily activity, each submission must contain Bible verses that focus the story. The book will be composed of 365 stories and will be no more than 500 words per story.

**Good things happened in Nicaragua**

Dr. R. A. Evans went on a Mission Trip to Nicaragua with several others from his church family in Harrisonburg, VA. Below is a recap in his own words. Our team left Harrisonburg at 1:30 a.m. Saturday morning. Our flight left Dulles at 5:35 a.m. and landed in El Salvador about at 7:35 a.m. where they saw church member Colleen and Dentist: Alan. They were on their return trip after serving in the Dental clinics all week. We arrived in Managua at 9:30 a.m. but had to wait for Sam (the main speaker for the crusade) who arrived at 1:30. After a drive of nearly 3 hours, we arrived at the mission house of



Voice of Hope in Las Penitas, northwest of Managua. The house is located on the black sand beaches of the Pacific Ocean.

We did a very simple drama each day about Sin-box-Sally. The drama (that kids really love) was about a girl who falls into sin and can't get free. One of the ladies played Sin-box-Sally each day. While Sin-box-Sally is trapped in sin, two singers come along and try to get her out of the sin-box, but they can't help her out of sin. A strong man comes by and he shows his muscles and tries to get her out but he can't. The two drunks come by and they are stumbling around and nearly knock her out of the box but like the others they can't get her out. Then the pastor comes by and shares the Gospel to the girl who confesses her sins and accepts Christ and then she is able to get out of the Sin-Box with the help of Christ.

We did three of these fiestas each day and at one of the first fiestas we had 48 young girls, 15 young boys, and 34 adults who gave their hearts to Jesus. In the second fiesta we had 26 young girls, 43 young boys, and 32 adults give their hearts to Jesus. A total of 231 individuals made decisions on our first full day in the field. Thirty-three of the individuals that made decisions were from one on one street ministering. That night we all went to the rally which was the first night of the crusade. There were 33 surrounding churches attending the crusade.

During the prior week, 56 individuals made decisions at the dental clinic and the week we were there, a total of 735 people made decisions for Christ. The last full day in Nicaragua was a day to rest and a time to enjoy the country. We went to a traditional Nicaraguan restaurant and had lunch and then we visited several museums and

historical churches where we met people that had accepted Christ with us during the week.

They were all so happy and it really made our day to visit with them and work on our Spanish. I can certainly see where Bro. Orlando Miller's passion comes from for these people. They are easy people to love. Thanks for your prayers and support. I could not have made the trip without them.
